My Involvement in the Synod and Synodality

In March 2022 Rev. Bishop Thomas Dabre of Pune diocese called for a meeting of representatives of all the Religious Congregations working in the diocese to discuss "Synod and Synodality", ways and means of making these words clear to every member of the parishes of Pune. The Synod group then divided their Zones into groups according to the area to which they belonged.

Without expecting it, I was suddenly called for a Zone meeting in March 2022. At the meeting there were 10-12 Sisters representing various congregations. This sudden meeting was quite disturbing for me as I had heard nothing about this process. I was both surprised and anxious. What was I doing here? The first question they put to me was "Would you please take over as coordinator for Zone 3?" What were they talking about? I did not want to take on that kind of responsibility. My answer was "I will get back to you in 2 days." During those 2 days memories came back of my great-great grand parents working whole heartedly for the Church. I could recall the stories they recounted while they sat under the old Sal tree (still in front of our house!). Was I going to be different from them? No.....NO! Memories came back.....The family sitting under the Sal tree, my priest uncle officiating, preparing for the Eucharist. The

Sacred Vessels were of Sal leaves woven together, 3 small Sal leaf holders for wine and water as well as a small plate for the hosts. (Is this not the same way Jesus must have celebrated with His apostles?)

All these thoughts inspired me to accept the responsibility as Coordinator of the 8 Religious communities including Novitiates in Zone 3. I was happy later when I heard their sharing about the different fields they are involved with. I felt deep joy being involved with different religious congregations. I understood better about Synod and Synodality. I learnt how to be in a wider community (Church). I appreciated the early Christian Communities, their simple life sharing and learning Jesus' life in story form. What they heard, saw and touched, they believed and lived as real followers of Christ.

Now again for PUNE CRI, Zone 3, I am elected to be Coordinator for several congregations of men and women religious (Please pray for me). I can only rely on God and the support of my RSCJ sisters to guide me for what He wants of me. I am grateful for the awareness of this unique call that He made to me even in my ups and downs. And I accept what He intends for me. I am in His Hands.
